N ot long ago, my dear niece received news that no one ever wants to hear—she was diagnosed with an aggressive form of cancer. Our family was shaken, feeling the weight of this storm, searching for comfort and hope. My niece is very close to me, and watching her struggle with fear and despair has been incredibly hard.

Just yesterday, while waiting for her second session of radiotherapy and chemotherapy, my niece met another patient. This woman, already through four sessions of chemo and now facing radiotherapy, had lost all her hair, eyebrows, and even her eyelids. Despite it all, they began to talk. The woman said, "Yes, it costs a lot, it's expensive, but thank God there is treatment available, and we are being treated." My niece nodded, acknowledging the financial strain, and said, "God provides us with the money we need for the treatment."

Then, the woman said something that shifted my niece's perspective: "I see many people leaving here without any treatment." So, my niece told her that it is sad to hear that many people go way without getting treatment. We could help them with some money for the treatment. But the woman replied, "It's not that they don't



have the money; it's that their cancer cannot be treated. There is no treatment available for them." Hearing this, my niece was overwhelmed. She told me how those words made her realize the blessing of having treatment options, even if they come with pain and challenges. She said, "Thank God we have treatment; even if we have to endure this suffering, thank God it can be treated."

When we are in a time of discouragement, depression, or doubt, we will find that the Lord knows just how to meet our need. Often, He will deal with a symptom before He deals with the problem. Why? So that we might be in a position to listen more clearly! When the Lord comes to Elijah in the First Reading for today, there are no sermons, no lectures, no threats, no reproaches and no rebukes. The Lord simply touches the prophet, meets his need and gently speaks to him. "Get up and eat, or the journey will be too long for you." May we always remember to find gratitude in our hearts, even in the face of adversity. Let us cherish the support of our community and the grace of God, who sustains us through all trials.
