n the midst of overwhelming complaints from the Israelites, Moses finds himself at the brink of despair. Exasperated, he questions God, lamenting the heavy burden of leadership placed upon him. In response, God offers solace by instructing Moses to gather seventy elders to share the load, promising to imbue them with a part of Moses' spirit.

This narrative, from the Book of Numbers, transcends its ancient context to impart timeless wisdom about leadership and humility. When the elders receive God's spirit, they briefly speak in ecstasy, signifying divine approval of their new roles. However, an unexpected event unfolds: Eldad and Meidad, two men who had not joined the gathering, also start prophesying in the camp. Joshua, Moses' assistant, urges Moses to stop them, perceiving their actions as a threat to Moses' unique authority.

Moses' response is profoundly instructive. Rather than silencing Eldad and Meidad, he expresses a wish for all of God's people to be prophets. In this moment, Moses reveals his true character as a leader unburdened by ego. He envisions a community where spiritual gifts are not monopolized but shared freely among all.

Moses' reaction contrasts sharply with the possessive nature often observed in leaders who cling to power and seek constant validation. His leadership is grounded in a desire to serve a higher purpose, not to assert his own significance. Commentators like Robert Alter and R. Samson Raphael Hirsch highlight that Moses' ultimate goal is the empowerment and spiritual elevation of the people, even to the point of rendering his own role superfluous.

Further along in Numbers, Moses demonstrates his selflessness again when he prepares Joshua to succeed him, transferring his authority generously and without jealousy. This act of humility prefigures the prophet Joel's eschatological vision where God's spirit will be poured out on all people, fulfilling Moses' wish on a grand scale.

The humility and selflessness of Moses, Eldad, Meidad, and even Joshua, who attempts to silence prophecies of his own future leadership out of respect for Moses, create a powerful tableau of genuine spiritual leadership. This narrative challenges us to reflect on our own leadership roles, urging us to prioritize service and community over personal glory.

As we gather this Sunday, let us meditate on Moses' example. In a world often dominated by self-serving leaders, Moses' story is a beacon of hope and a reminder that true leadership is not about personal accolade but about uplifting others and serving a purpose greater than oneself. May we strive to embody such selflessness in our own lives and communities.

#### Confirmation 2025 & Communion 2025

Exciting News! Applications for St. Joseph's Confirmation and Communion Programmes for 2025 are available from September 1st in the Church porch.

**Confirmation:** For those entering Year 9 or above, application forms for the coming year's Confirmation course will be available in the Church porch from 1st September and must be returned along with a copy of your child's baptismal certificate by 1st October at the latest. The course begins in November, with the Sacrament being conferred on Sunday 29th June at 12 midday - Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. There are 12 sessions which take place on Sunday evenings at 5.30pm and include attendance at the 7pm Mass. There are an additional 2 sessions with parents. You can already email your interest to confirmation.joseph@gmail.com and you will receive a reminder when the forms are available.

**Communion:** For children aged seven and above in Year 3 or higher, forms are due by November 1st. Preparation takes place during the 10am Sunday Mass from January to June. Email communion.joseph@gmail.com for more details.
