In the Gospel for today, we witness the profound moment when Jesus steps into the synagogue, unrolling the scroll of Isaiah, and boldly proclaiming His mission to transform lives. Here, Jesus is not just introducing an abstract concept or a

distant hope. He is declaring a present reality—a divine upheaval that redefines existence itself. This scriptural passage invites us to reflect on the nature of true change, the kind that only God can initiate through the living presence of Christ.
