

In a recent document titled "Antiqua et Nova," the Dicasteries for the Doctrine of the Faith and for Culture and Education explore the potential and challenges of artificial intelligence (AI) across various sectors, including education, economy, healthcare, and warfare. Framed by Pope Francis's warnings on Al, the document underscores the necessity for Al to serve human dignity and the common good. It warns against AI's misuse in warfare, highlighting the alarming potential of autonomous weapons systems to operate beyond human oversight. Moreover, the document cautions against AI's capacity to heighten social inequalities, noting ethical concerns related to the concentration of AI power among a few corporations. In education, while AI is seen to enhance learning, it also risks undermining critical thinking if not properly managed. The Note advocates for careful oversight to prevent AI from negatively impacting human relations, especially in healthcare and employment. Emphasizing ethical responsibility, it calls for AI to complement rather than replace human intelligence.
