Choosing to Live Large



In the gospel of Luke 6:27-38, Jesus presents us with a revolutionary approach to life, inviting us to break away from the cycles of retaliation and to embrace the power of love and forgiveness. Each day, we stand at a crossroads, confronted with the decision to choose greatness or smallness in our actions and attitudes.

Choosing the path of smallness binds us to a life where we constantly tally wrongs, respond with aggression, and permit the actions of others to dictate our behaviour. It is an insular choice, one that prioritizes self-preservation and retaliation over understanding and compassion. However, Christ calls us to a different path—one of largeness.

Living large means daring to transcend our natural impulses for security and power. It entails opening up to a life less governed by fear and more infused with empathy and love. Choosing to be large allows us to create space for others, to be channels of peace and understanding in a world rife with pain and misunderstanding. It challenges us to look beyond our own immediate stories and recognize that each person we encounter carries hidden burdens of their own.


In our communities and beyond, we are often unaware of who is barely holding on, who requires a kind word, a gentle touch, or a heartfelt prayer. By choosing to love our enemies, bless those who curse us, and forgive rather than judge, we become bearers of light in someone else's darkness. Once weekly, 6 weeks. The first session will be centred around Abraham and the three visitors (Genesis 18, 1-15) and Andrei Rublev's icon The Trinity. Subsequent sessions will use Jesus's Last Discourse (Gospel of John, Chapters 14-17). We will use the lectio divina framework: a meditative and prayerful reading of the biblical text.
