LEGACY OF FAITH

As we gather today beneath the statues of Saints Peter and Paul at our church entrance, we recall the incredible legacy of these two pillars of faith. We commemorate their martyrdom under Emperor Nero in 64 A.D., marking their unwavering commitment to Christ. According to tradition, Peter was crucified upside down, while Paul, as a Roman citizen, was beheaded. Despite these differing paths, their shared dedication to spreading the gospel unites us and offers a profound example of unity in diversity.

Clement of Rome, a generation later, urged the Church in Corinth to look to Peter and Paul as noble examples of endurance. Peter endured trials from jealousy and strife, while Paul faced imprisonment, exile, and stoning with resilience.
