n the hustle and bustle of everyday life, the story of Mary and Martha from Luke 10:38-42 offers a profound message about finding peace and power in the presence of Jesus. While Martha was busy preparing for her guest, Mary chose to sit at Jesus' feet, drinking in His teachings. Jesus praised Mary for her choice, illustrating the value of spiritual nourishment over worldly tasks.

This biblical tale resonates with a modern concept called 'aura farming', which focuses on cultivating one's inner self. It's about being authentic and present, much like young Rayan from Indonesia, who became famous simply by being true to himselfjoyful and genuine. Aura farming encourages us to embrace our unique identities and find fulfilment



in spiritual growth rather than external validation.

From Mary and Martha, we learn key lessons about prioritizing what truly matters. First, we are reminded to "own our look" by being genuine and present like Mary, who prioritized her time with Jesus over societal expectations. Second, we are encouraged to "say less and do more," embodying the stillness that Mary exemplified as she sat at Jesus' feet.

In practicing these lessons, we can forget our cares, feed our souls, focus our priorities, and ultimately find ourselves, as Mary did, in the peace and contentment that comes from being in Jesus' presence.

This week, I invite you to embrace the quiet moments with God. Let's be farmers of the soul, nurturing our spiritual aura—not through doing more, but by being still and knowing that He is God. Amen.
