n Jeremiah 38, the prophet is thrown into a deep, muddy cistern—left to sink, alone, in darkness. He cannot climb out by himself. But God sends help through Ebed-Melech, who gently lifts Jeremiah to

Depression can feel just like that cistern—dark, heavy, and inescapable. Many of us have been there, or perhaps are there now. Sometimes, like Jeremiah, we didn't choose the pit. Life's losses, broken relationships, illness, unprocessed grief, or even a slow loss of faith, can bring us to a place where hope feels far away.

Medicine, therapy, and rest are gifts from God, just as Ebed-Melech's rope and cloth were. But our faith also invites us to look deeper—not to blame ourselves for depression, but to listen for its message. Are we carrying grief we have not been allowed to express? Are there boundaries we have been too afraid to set? Are we spiritually exhausted, perhaps feeling far from God?

Depression can sometimes numb us, hiding emotions we fear to face. Yet, in Christ, all our emotions are safe to bring into the light. Even the anger or grief we've silenced can lead us toward healing when we offer it honestly to God in prayer.

And just as Jeremiah could not rescue himself, so too we may need others to help us out of our pit—friends, counsellors, doctors, and our church family. That is not weakness; it is God's design that we carry one another's burdens.

If you feel you are in the mud today, remember: God has not abandoned you. He is already sending someone—or something—to lift you up. And if you know someone in the pit, perhaps you are their Ebed-Melech, sent to bring them light and hope.
