

Cohen's Hallelujah

his Sunday, let us pause and reflect on the journey of Leonard Cohen's song "Hallelujah"—a story that beautifully mirrors what it means to walk through life's "narrow doors."

When Cohen wrote "Hallelujah," it took him years and countless rewrites. He poured his heart and soul into every line. But when he finally finished, his record company rejected it. The song was hardly noticed for many years. It seemed as if his hard work would fade into silence—a story ended before it even began.

But the story did not end there. Another musician, John Cale, discovered Cohen's hidden masterpiece and made a new version. Then Jeff Buckley, inspired by Cale, recorded his own soulful cover. Though Buckley died young, his voice gave the song new life. Soon, "Hallelujah" was covered by hundreds of artists,



shared at weddings, in movies, and at countless gatherings. The song nobody wanted became a hymn for millions.

What does this teach us? Jesus calls us to enter through the "narrow door"—the hard path of patience, love, and faith, especially when life doesn't go our way. Cohen's journey shows us that even when our efforts are unseen or rejected, God can still turn them into blessings. Our struggles, just like Cohen's song, can transform into hope and beauty for

If you face closed doors or disappointments, remember: don't give up. In God's hands, your broken "hallelujah" can become something wondrous. Be patient and faithful. Walk through that narrow door. Your story—no matter how small or hidden—just might inspire the world.


