



The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross calls us to look directly at something the world often tries to avoid: the reality of suffering, weakness, and death. More and more, crosses are being removed from schools, hospitals, and public places, as if the world wishes to erase the reminder of human frailty. Yet for us as Christians, the cross is not a symbol of defeat but the great sign of victory and

Our culture longs for a neat and tidy death, one untouched by weakness or loss of dignity. But death is rarely clean. It comes with pain, struggle, and often dependence on others. Sallie Tisdale reminds us that we cannot control every detail of our dying, and that the pursuit of "dignity" at all costs may blind us to what is most human. Jesus, in His own dying, teaches us that true dignity is not lost in suffering. His humanity revealed in weakness on the

cross becomes the greatest manifestation of God's glory.

It was precisely in that moment of surrender, when the Beloved Son was nailed and broken, that the Father intervened with the unimaginable gift of resurrection. The lesson is clear: every cross we carry today—whether illness, grief, fear, or quiet daily struggles—is an opportunity for the Father to act within us. Just as He did not abandon Jesus, He will not abandon us. Our crosses prepare the way for resurrection.

Even our funeral symbols speak this truth. At funerals we do not place a crucifix on the coffin but stand a Paschal Candle beside it. The crucifix reminds us that death is real, but the candle proclaims that death does not have the last word. Life in Christ will always rise. So let us never be ashamed of the cross, but exalt it. In our crosses, God is near. In our Good Fridays, Easter dawn is already waiting.
