It is a blessing to come together again as a parish family. This past week, I had the chance to return home and remember my mother on the anniversary of her passing. It made me reflect deeply on the kind of legacy she left for me and our family-a true spiritual legacy that still warms my heart.

One childhood memory stands out: our old firewood stove. On the surface, it often seemed cold and covered in lifeless ashes. But underneath, glowing embers waited patiently. My mother would gently fan them into new flames to prepare warm meals for us. She once told me, "Life is like this: there's always an ember left underneath. We just need to fan it into flames." She lived this wisdom, especially when times were tough. Whenever she felt burdened by life, she turned to prayer, finding strength by handing her worries to God.

This comforting lesson also appears in Saint Paul's words to Timothy in this Sunday's reading: "Fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you." Like Timothy, we can sometimes feel drained by our daily struggles or overwhelmed by doubt. Yet, Paul and my mother remind us: the gifts God planted in us—at baptism, confirmation, and in quiet moments-never truly die. Even if hidden, they can be rekindled.

This October, as the Church invites us to pray the Rosary, let us bring our joys, sorrows, and hopes to Jesus and Mary. Through these prayers, we gently fan our own inner embers into living

May we all discover the glowing embers within, fanning them into flames of hope, love, and kindness this week.
